**SUPPLEMENTAL RULE REQUIRING THE ELECTRONIC FILING
OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION AND EXPENSE REPORTS**

In IBT delegate elections held in 1990-91, 1995-96 and 2000-01 and international officer elections held in 1990-91, 1995-96, 1998 and 2000-01, individual candidates, slates and independent committees were required to file campaign contribution and expenditure reports, a supplemental form no. 1, and a vendor report (collectively, "CCERs") disclosing their campaign finances. The Election Officers (and, with regard to the election held in 2000-01, the Election Administrator) promulgated CCER forms for individual candidates, slates and independent committees to use in making these required filings.

In 1990-91 and 1995-96, CCERs were filled out and filed as paper submissions. In 2000-01, the Election Administrator partially automated the CCER process using software that a filer could run on a stand-alone computer.

The *Rules for the 2005-2006 IBT International Union Delegate and Officer Election ("2006 Rules")* were agreed to and approved with the established CCER system in mind, but authorize the Election Supervisor to issue a supplemental rule requiring the secure electronic filing of CCERs. *2006 Rules*, Art. XI, § 2(c). This supplemental rule, issued under that authority, provides that candidates, slates and independent committees are required to file CCERs using the Election Supervisor's secure web-based system for preparing and filing those reports.

The web-based CCER system developed by the Office of the Election Supervisor should increase the accuracy and timeliness of reporting, and the efficiency of preparing reports. The Office of the Election Supervisor also expects that the web-based CCER system will allow for timely and efficient oversight and investigation of any issues presented by filings (including any misuse of the system itself or the data it contains). The web-based CCER system has been designed to track information in accordance with the *2006 Rules*, and to produce reports in compliance with those rules. No special software is required to run the web-based CCER system: it may be used from any PC with access to the internet, and that can support current versions of Internet Explorer.



Pursuant to the general grant of authority under Art. I of the *2006 Rules* and the specific language of Art. XI, § 2(c), all individual candidates, slates, and independent committees required by the *2006 Rules* to disclose their campaign finances shall make such filings as are required through the secure, electronic means provided by the Election Supervisor's web-based CCER system. Each individual candidate, slate or independent committee must contact the Office of the Election Supervisor to establish a CCER account as necessary to use the system.
