CERTIFICATION OF CANDIDATE ACCREDITATION

The Office of the Election Supervisor ("OES") has completed its review of candidate accreditation petitions submitted by the Sandy Pope 2011 Campaign before the December 15, 2010 deadline. *See Rules for the 2010-2011 IBT International Union Delegate and Officer Election ("2011 Rules")*, Article X, § 3.


To become an accredited candidate for International office, an otherwise eligible member must obtain signatures on petitions of at least 2.5% of the relevant membership pool. *See 2011 Rules*, Article X, § 1; July 14, 2010 *Advisory on Accreditation of Candidates and Publication of Campaign Literature in The Teamster*. On June 1, 2010, OES published the minimum number of valid signatures that an otherwise eligible member would need to obtain for accreditation for union-wide office (the only threshold relevant to the submitted petitions), as follows:

On December 14, 2010, the Sandy Pope 2011 Campaign delivered to the OES Form 5 petitions (individual candidate) and requested accreditation of Sandy Pope as a candidate for IBT General President. The petitions were checked in accordance with Article X, § 4(a)(1) of the *2011 Rules*. OES determined that the submitted petitions presented 48,460 complete and properly submitted signatures for Ms. Pope. OES analyzed the submitted signatures using a statistical sampling method, and has determined that the petitions contain more than the minimum number of valid signatures to accredit Ms. Pope as a candidate for International Union Office.

Pursuant to Article X of the *2011 Rules*, the Election Supervisor certifies Sandy Pope as an accredited candidate for union-wide IBT office.
