Gentlemen:

A protest has been filed, a copy of which is attached, pursuant to Article XI of the Rules for the IBT International Union Delegate and Officer Election, revised August 1, 1990 ("Rules"), by Brian C. Palmer, the certified delegate from Local 526 to the IBT International Convention. Mr. Palmer alleges the Local has refused to provide him with an advance for per diem expenses as set forth in the Advisory Regarding Convention Expenses ("Advisory") issued by the Election Officer on April 19, 1991.

Mr. Palmer states that on or about May 19, 1991, he sent a letter requesting an advance of the per diem expense money as set forth in the Advisory. The letter further states that upon his return from the Convention he will provide the Local with receipts for Convention related expenses. 1/ Given his travel plans, Mr. Palmer requested that the advance be given to him before June 19, 1991. On or about June 18, 1991, Mr.

Mr. Palmer will be obliged, of course, to return any advance expense monies not documented by receipts.

Palmer contacted the Local Union office concerning the advance for per diem expenses and was advised that no advance would be provided by the Local Union. He was told that he should submit his receipts upon his return from the Convention and presumably receive reimbursement at that time. Mr. Andrade, Secretary-Treasurer of the Local, has stated that the Local does not have sufficient funds to advance any sum for per diem expenses to Mr. Palmer.

Attendance by delegates at the Convention is official Union business. Article II, Section 10(d) of the Rules requires Local Unions to send and pay the expenses of all delegates to which the Local is entitled to be Convention. In the Advisory, the Election Officer states that each Local is responsible for the per diem expenses of its delegates. The Election Officer has determined that a reasonable per diem expense allotment is \$130.00 for each day of attendance at the Convention up to seven days. This sum is in addition to payment for transportation and hotel expenses which is also an obligation of the Local. Delegates are required to furnish receipts to the Local supporting any expenditures and to return all advanced expense monies not so documented.

A refusal by the Local to advance per diem expense monies to a delegate is unreasonable and a violation of the Rules. Advisory page 4. The Independent Administrator has determined that the Advisory is consistent with the Rules and that its directives will not be disturbed by the Independent Administrator. Hasegawa and IBT Local Union No. 174 and Teamsters Joint Council 28, 91 Elec.App. 156 (SA), June 6, 1991, aff'd No. 88 Civ. 4486 (DNE) Order (D.C.N.Y. June 19, 1991).

Accordingly, the protest is **Granted**. The Secretary-Treasurer of Local 526, Alfred Andrade, is hereby directed to advance to Brian C. Palmer the sum

of \$910.00 no later than the close of business on June 21, 1991. An appeal of this decision shall not stay this order to advance the monies to Mr. Palmer.

If any interested party is not satisfied with this determination, they may request a hearing before the Independent Administrator within twenty-four (24) hours of their receipt of this letter. The parties are reminded that, absent extraordinary circumstances, no party may rely upon evidence that was not presented to the Office of the Election Officer in any such appeal. Requests for a hearing shall be made in writing, and shall be filed with the Office of the Independent Administrator, IBT, c/o Walt Disney World Dolphin Hotel, Suite 1033, 1500 EPCOT Resort Boulevard, Lake Buena Vista, Florida 32810, Facsımile (407) 560-1370. of the request for hearing must be served on the parties listed above, as well as upon the Election Officer, IBT, c/o Walt Disney World Dolphin Hotel, Australia 3, 1500 EPCOT Resort Boulevard, Lake Buena Vista, Florida 32820, Facsimile (407) 560-1365. A copy of the protest must accompany the request for a hearing.

DECISION OF THE INDEPENDENT ADMINISTRATOR

This matter arises out of an appeal from a decision of the Election Officer in Case No. CONV-5-LU526-ENG. Mr. Willard Barnes, an attorney for Local 526, appealed the decision of the Election Officer by letter dated June 25, 1991. It is not necessary to conduct a hearing in this matter as the facts are simple and uncontested.

This matter concerns the Election Officer's "Advisory Concerning Convention Expenses" ("Advisory"). In the Advisory, the Election Officer states that a \$130 per diem payment is a reasonable daily allowance for the delegate expenses during the Convention. In reviewing the Advisory in the matter of <u>In Re: Hasaqawa</u>, 91 - Elec. App. - 156 (SA) (June 6, 1991), the Independent Administrator stated as follows:

The Advisory reflects a well reasoned approach to regulating a Local Union's obligation to defer the expenses of delegates and alternate delegates attending the IBT Convention as well as the Local's obligation in regards to compensating delegates and alternate delegates for their lost wages while attending the Convention. The Advisory is consistent with the Rules For The IBT International Union Delegate And Officer Election ("Election Rules") and reflect the Election Officer's expertise. The Advisory is deserving of great difference and its directives will not be disturbed. In short, any appeals regarding the substance of the Advisory will be summarily denied. Appeals concerning the application of the Advisory's directives, however, will, of course, be

considered in due course.

Local 526 claims, by way of Mr. Barnes' letter, that:

[T]he Local Union is financially unable to advance the per diem expense money. This was explained to Mr. Palmer at a General Membership meeting on May 19, 1991. In addition, it was explained that the Local does not advance expense money, but normally reimburses actual expenses after receiving proper receipts.

The Election Officer's Advisory requires Local Unions to advance its delegates and alternate delegates the per diem expenses regardless of the past practice of the Local. At this time, however, because the Convention is already underway, I will allow the Union to reimburse Mr. Palmer for all of his Convention expenses up to the \$130 per diem allotment. Pursuant to the Advisory, Mr. Palmer must supply to the Local with receipts documenting all of his expenditures. Should the Local question any of Mr. Palmer's expenses, however, it must first reimburse him for those expenses and then request relief through the office of the Election Officer.
