## Gentlemen

A pre-election protest was filed by James S Powell Jr pursuant to Article XI of the Rule for the IBT International Union Delegate and Officer Election, revised August 1, 1990 ("Election Rules") In his protest the complainant alleges that Local Union 688 violated the Article VIII, Section 1 of the Election Rules by failing to respond to his request to inspect and take notes from the collective bargaining agreements covering the members of Local Union 688 The Election Officer's investigation of the protest revealed the following facts

The complainant made a request of the Local Union Secretary-Treasurer to review and make notes from all collective bargaining agreements covering members of the Local Union by letter dated October 31, 1990. The letter was faxed to the Local Union's office. Having received no response to his request, the complainant filed his protest on November 7, 1990. By letter dated November 8, 1990 the Local Union, through its counsel, acknowledged the request and stated that the agreements were available for review. The complainant was informed that there was a considerable number of agreements and that he should call the Secretary-Treasurer of the Local Union to make arrangements to review the agreements.

Article VIII, Section 1 of the Election Rules requires Local Unions to make collective bargaining agreements available for inspection and note taking by candidates and their representatives upon request. Moreover, implicit in the Election Rules is the requirement that the agreements be made available on a reasonable basis. It appears that the Local Union is prepared to make the agreements available for inspection and therefore the instant protest is moot. However, the complainant is free to file a new

protest if the Local Union fails to make such agreements available for inspection and note taking on a reasonable basis.

If any interested party is not satisfied with this determination, they may request a hearing before the Independent Administrator within twenty-four (24) hours of their receipt of this letter. The parties are reminded that, absent extraordinary circumstances, no party may rely upon evidence that was not presented to the Office of the Election Officer in any such appeal Requests for a hearing shall be made in writing, and shall be served on Independent Administrator Frederick B Lacey at LeBoeuf, Lamb, Leiby & MacRae, One Gateway Center, Newark, New Jersey 07102-5311, Facsimile (201) 622-6693.
