Gentlemen

A pre-election protest was filed pursuant to Article XI of the Rules for the IBT International Union Delegate and Officer Election, revised August 1, 1990 ("Rules"). The complainant, Wesley Epperson, alleges in his protest that the Election Office, through its representatives, has failed to obtain adequate and secure facilities for the return of the mail ballots that are to be cast in the delegate and alternate delegate election for Local Union 41.

As John Sullivan, the Election Office Protest and Compliance Coordinator, informed Mr Epperson, the Election Office has obtained the largest post office box available in the main Kansas City Post Office (a number four sized box). There is only one size box bigger than the one obtained (a number five box), and, even if obtained, the larger box would not alone be sufficient to hold all of the ballots expected to be cast As Mr Sullivan explained, it is normal Postal Service procedure to store all excess mail which will not fit into the box in a secure location, under exclusive control of the Post Office, until the date of ballot return pick up At the time of pick up, all mail received, whether stored in the box or within the Post Office, will be released only to Mr. William O Eisler, Mr. Robert Belling or Mr. Daniel I Koen, Election Officer representatives, the only persons authorized to receive the returned ballots.

Further, as Mr Sullivan noted, it is a federal offense for anyone, whether a Postal employee or not, to in any way tamper with or improperly receive or deliver the mail Therefore, given the confidence that I have in Messrs Eisler, Eisler, and Koen, and given the systems utlized by the Postal Service, I conclude that the Post Office box obtained is both sufficient and secure

A copy of the protest must accompany the request for a hearing
